# ARE YOU HOPING TO MOVE FORWARD BY DWELLING ON THE PAST?



- We remember what we have experienced.
  - Significant emotional events imprint more strongly than other events.
  - We prefer to remember the good things, even though the bad things may outweigh the good.

- We favor information that agrees with us.
  - Familiarity creates a sense of comfort, while change can be difficult.
  - Confirmation bias is the tendency to use information that confirms or supports our beliefs or values.

- We want reality to mimic our idealized perceptions.
  - The Mandela effect refers to a situation in which a large mass of people believes that an event occurred when it did not.

- Don't dwell on the past.
  - Events of the past may have had a significant impact on us, but they cannot be re-created.
  - We may have had a significant impact on the world around us at one time, but that can not be re-created.

- We should respect, not revere, tradition.
  - Respect for tradition can provide a firm foundation for the future.
  - Reverence for tradition can create resistance to or prevent change.
  - How can one find a balance point?



- Boomer worldview:

- Today's worldview:
  - Feelings
    Status
    Self
  - Choices are based on temporal perceptions.

- Boomer worldview:
  - Decisions and actions are based on discernment.
  - Internal locus of control.
  - Uncertainty is addressed by applying historical evidence and known truths to possible future outcomes.

- Today's worldview:
  - Decisions and actions are based on the perceptions of others.
  - External locus of control.
  - Uncertainty is addressed by trying to predict what the opinions of others may look like in the future.

- Respected elders are revered for their ability to pass on wisdom and tradition.
  - The key to getting the attention of the young is to not denigrate what they see as their truths.
  - The key to getting the respect of the young is to point out how certain proven truths can provide insights to an uncertain future.

- Don't talk about what once was, talk about what can be.
- Frame your memories in terms of universal truth statements.
  - "We used to play outside until dark" becomes the importance of establishing community safety and security.

- Our way won't be their way, but it can provide a foundation for consideration.
- Project your recollections as new images for the future. Respect for life becomes caring for others.

- Understanding roles and responsibilities is each person's purpose in the world.
  - We must teach that we are all part of something bigger than ourselves.
- Be able to argue on behalf of Truth.
  - Whose truth prevails?

 Respect the fact that younger generations have opinions that they consider truth.

 Seek to expand the concept of universal Truth beyond a localized and temporal truth.

- Eschew external locus of control;
  - "believe the science"
  - "experts agree"
  - Overcome intellectual torpor
  - Avoid being managed rather than encouraged
